





Background

FreeRice (WFP) is an interactive game which requires participants to answer multiple choice questions (grouped by category). Answering questions leads to participants offering 10 grains of rice to FreeRice for every one question.

The FreeRice project has been rolled out across the whole Doha Academy community and led to excellent participation levels by both students and staff. The main aim has been to raise awareness of global challenges relating to food provision around the world. We are proud to confirm that we have now reached 10,000 free meals!


